

CALCULATE YOUR IMPORT TAX FROM VIETNAM

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FIRST THREE STEPS

- 1. Figure out your HS Code
- 2. Look up your HS Code in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule
- 3. You will see the import tax you must pay for that HS Code

What is the Harmonized Tariff Schedule?

The Harmonized Tariff Schedule is the master index of HS Codes. This schedule (index) was created by the World Customs Organization (WCO) to categorize goods into approximately 5,000 commodity groups. This system is accepted and implemented by more than 200 countries worldwide.





What is a HS Code?

Every product that is traded around the world has a specific HS Code.

Ladies Waterproof Windbreaker

HS Code: 6202.92.30

Ski Boots HS Code:

6402.12.00

Coffee not Roasted

HS Code: 0901.11.00

Teak Chairs

HS Code: 9401.61.20

HS Codes usually consist of a 6-10 digit number

Chocolate bar HS CODE: 1806.32






The easiest way to figure out your HS Code it go to this website:

https://www.wcotradetools.org/en/harmonized-system

Click down into the index until you get to last window and you will see your HS Code







USA Example Continued

Let's say you want the import tax for a t-shirt made in Vietnam and shipped to the USA.

You know the HS Code is 6109.10 because you looked it up at www.wcotradetools.org/en/harmonized-system

You have the USA HTS (Harmonized tariff schedule)



USA Example Continued

Here you see the HS Code and description of a t-shirt made of cotton. The import tax is 16.5%.



You then multiply 16.5% x the FOB price of your product.

Most countries assess the import tax based on CIF price.





Every country has their own unique Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS)


I don't know which product you are importing and I don't know which country you are importing into so I can only give you examples. You will have to figure our your HS Code and find your country specific HTS to find out your import tax.

USA EXAMPLE: google US Harmonized Tariff Schedule You will see: https://hts.usitc.gov/current

If you are importing into England then look up the HTS for UK

If you are importing into India the look up the HTS for India

BE AWARE that some countries give the HTS a different name. For example Australia calls it: Combined Australian Customs Tariff Nomenclature and Statistical Classification or 'Working Tariff'.







What are Incoterms?

Incoterms provide a universal set of rules and guidelines that help facilitate trade. In essence, they provide a common language traders can use to set the terms for their trades.

Note the difference between FOB and CIF. The infographic defines FOB and CIF.

When factories quote you a price they will say: \$5 FOB or \$5.76 CIF as an example.

You can negotiate whatever Incoterms you want. Most factories sell on FOB terms.







TWO OPTIONS FOR GETTING HELP

Most governments offer a free service to determine your import tax. You just need to email then and ask for help.

(note: you will be leaving the USITC.gov web site) Once you find a valid HTS classification, you can find the tariff rates by clicking on the appropriate chapter (the first two digits of the HTS number).
